Blue Bar Dress Code Guidelines

I. **Shirts must have collars**

- A. No t-shirts will be allowed
- B. Collar-less shirts that are worn with blazers, sweaters or vest will be accepted. This attire is appropriate and is considered night club attire.
- C. No tank tops or sleeveless shirts will be accepted.

II. **No caps or bandanas**

- A. Exceptions to this would be hats with a full brim, i.e., Cowboy hats and Tango hats.
- B. Caps with a frontal brims or not considered hats and will not be allowed. Examples of caps are baseball caps and visors.
- C. All bandanas are not allowed either on a patrons head or displayed on their clothing. This also includes Doo-Rags and Beanie style caps

III. **No athletic footwear**

- A. This includes no tennis shoes or basketball style shoes.
- B. Shoes must be clean and in good condition.
- C. Leather style sandals that are in good taste and in good conditions will be accepted.
- D. No flip flops will be allowed.

IV. **No professional/collegiate sports team clothing or insignias**

- A. Exception to this would be casino sponsored sports nights.
- B. Jerseys of any kind are not to be permitted.

C. T-shirts displaying a team logo will not be permitted.

V. **No excessively baggy clothing**

A. Pants should not hang over the patron's shoe and should not bunch up more than 3-4 inches at the bottom of a patron's leg.

B. Pants should be worn at the waist and the crotch area should not hang down near the patron's inner thigh.

C. Shirts should not go past the patron's mid-pant pocket and should be squared at the bottom of the shirt.

D. Use discretion and your better judgment when dealing with larger patrons. A valid attempt must be made by the larger patron to be in compliance.

VI. **Clothing must be clean and in good condition**

A. Clothing should not be dirty or soiled.

B. Clothing should not be torn, ripped or have holes. Use discretion and your better judgment when dealing with patron's that are wearing fashionably torn, ripped or holey clothing.

VII. **All patrons should present a valid identification**

A. All identifications should meet the casino's required minimum guidelines.

VIII. **All patrons are subject to a pat-down for weapons or a bag check**

A. All officers should look for bulges in clothing and should conduct a pat-down at their own discretion.

B. Random bag checks should be done at the officer's discretion

VIII. **No head or facial tattoos**

A. Any tattoos that are on bald heads or on any part of a patron's face are not permitted. No exceptions.

B. Any gang related tattoos visual on any part of a patron's body should not be permitted. No exceptions.
